# **Report of Clinical Activities and Innovations**

#### **Current Licensure and Certification**

#### **Practice Activities**

1995-2009 Attending Clinical Psychologist Medical Surgical Intensive Care 30 hours/week Boston Children's Hospital

Between the years of 1995-2009, I served as an Attending Psychologist for the Medical Surgical Intensive Care Unit (MSICU) to provide direct psychological services to critically ill children and their families, conduct staff support rounds, and lead psychosocial rounds and bereavement circles. Since 2009, I have transitioned from direct service provision and consultation on the MSICU to provide consultation and innovative experiential education across a wide range of settings. My clinical activity, sensibilities and innovation are the wellspring of my teaching, research and scholarship. In my former role as Director of the Institute for Professionalism & Ethical Practice, I developed and taught half-day, full-day and hour-long rounds aimed at the spectrum of difficult conversations in health care, develop

and implement innovative educational offerings to address the hospital's clinical and strategic priorities, such as parent presence during invasive procedures, organ donation after cardiac death, apology and disclosure following adverse medical outcomes, and aligning expectations during surgical informed consent. Additionally, as Director of the Institute, I conceptualized and co-produced clinical educational films, oversaw a vigorous program of research and produce scholarship, offer interprofessional Program to Enhance Relational and Communication Skills (PERCS) Rounds to support communication and relational learning across the hospital and Harvard Medical School-affiliated hospitals, and write grants. To prepare for new educational offerings and to keep my clinical skills sharp, I served as participant observer and consultant in clinical settings as diverse as the advanced fetal care center, pre-operative clinic and post-surgical floors, and the Department of Radiology. Since 2010, I have served as a volunteer at Home and Hospice Care of Rhode Island and carry a caseload of pediatric and adult patients and their families across home, residential, and inpatient hospice settings.

#### **Clinical Innovations**

The Clinical Interview for Parents of Preterm Infants (CLIPP) (1993)

This semi-structured interview serves as a means to assess and develop psychosocial interventions for high-risk preterm infants, their parents and families in the NICU. The interview has been published and incorporated widely in NICU clinical practice and research.

Family-based psychosocial intervention with high-risk infants and their families (1994, 1996, 1998)

At the time, this innovative model of psychosocial intervention in the NICU incorporated the Brazelton Neonatal Assessment Scale, was among the successful precursors of what is now as family-centered care and emphasized discharge preparation. Early outcomes included improved infant feeding interaction and maternal psychological wellbeing. The work has been published and serves as a NICU model to this day.

Kids' Klub NICU sibling visitation intervention (1996)

This innovative intervention was introduced during a time when sibling visitation was not permitted in the NICU. The intervention was developed based on a clinical research initiative that assessed and addressed staff attitudes and concerns about sibling visitation pre and post intervention. The work contributed to clinical practice change to welcome siblings to the NICU.

Mental health consultation, bereavement support, emotional standard of care and interprofessional psychosocial rounds clinical practice change in the PICU (1996, 1997, 2002, 2006, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016) Pioneered the role of psychology and mental health consultation in the PICU that led to weekly interprofessional rounds and psychosocial interventions for PICU patients and their families, including bereavement support, psychology liaison and resource manual entitled, "In the Middle of the Night." The model, resources and patient referral pattern data have been published and influenced sustained changed clinical practice.

Retreat model of psychosocial support and intervention for families of children on the autism spectrum (2010) Developed annual weekend retreat model of intervention for 60 parents of children on the autism spectrum that has just celebrated its 20th year. The retreat model has been presented at the Autism Society of America, published, and replicated nationally.

Parent presence during invasive procedures and resuscitation clinical practice change (2007, 2012)

Conducted clinical research to examine parent and staff attitudes and clinical practice regarding parent presence during invasive procedures and resuscitation, clinical practice guidelines established. The work has been presented nationally, published, educational film made and widely influenced clinical practice to educate and support parents at the bedside.

Wizard of OZ approach to challenging conversations in healthcare to promote the emotional standard of care of patients and families (2014, 2016)

Developed the Wizard of OZ approach to difficult conversations in healthcare, emphasizing the core ingredients of courage, brains and heart, and promoting the emotional standard of care for patients and families. Gave well-received TEDx Talk, presented widely and published.

# **Report of Teaching and Educational Innovations**

Program to Enhance Relational and Communication Skills innovative pedagogy and educational initiative (PERCS) (2007, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2020)

Innovative experiential educational rounds and workshops proven to improve clinicians' sense of preparation, confidence, communication skills, ability to establish relationships, and to decrease anxiety when holding difficult conversations in healthcare. Integrates interprofessional learning and family faculty. Adapted to a wide range of conversations including neonatal and pediatric critical care, anesthesia, neurology, palliative care, radiology, ophthalmology, surgery, spirituality, informed consent, and adverse medical outcomes. Widely presented and published, and replicated nationally and internationally.

Gap Analysis assessment of communication skills and self-appraisal (2009, 2010)

Developed means for self and multi-rater feedback for PICU clinicians to raise self-awareness about communication strengths and areas for growth. Published and among the most widely cited articles in Simulation in Healthcare.

Improvisational simulated patient paradigm including Actor Character Development Sheet and learner-based creation of case scenarios (2014 a,b)

Developed improvisational actor paradigm and structured means to develop character case scenario backstories that are tailored to needs of learners and course learning objectives. Actor Character Development Sheet presented and published.

Clinician recognition, reflection and management of emotions (2015, 2016)

Incorporated means during educational offerings for clinicians to self-assess, reflect and develop toolbox to address their most common emotions during difficult healthcare conversations in order to optimize care.

Live moderated on-line workshop design (2016)

Worked with social media platform OPENPediatrics to develop, pilot and evaluate on-line live faculty educational workshop design that can simultaneously accommodate remote learners locally and globally.

# **Narrative Report**

## **Clinical Expertise and Innovation**

Trained in nursing, clinical psychology, and bioethics, I have worked for over twenty-five years in neonatal and pediatric critical care settings focusing on parental perspectives and priorities for care, pediatric end-of-life care, challenging conversations in healthcare, the ethics of everyday clinical encounters, and humanism in health care. My clinical innovation and scholarship have enhanced the quality of family-provider communication and relationships, improved delivery of psychosocial services, and deepened the emotional standard of care. My work has promoted meaningful clinical practice changes including sibling visitation in critical care settings, parent presence during invasive procedures and resuscitation, and interprofessional teamwork. I have contributed to pioneering the role of pediatric psychology in neonatal and pediatric intensive care settings. My clinical teaching efforts, research, and scholarship have promoted innovative simulation-based interprofessional communication and relational learning, nationally and internationally. As Founding Director of the Institute for Professionalism and Ethical Practice at Boston Children's Hospital, I oversaw the training of over 6,000 interprofessional learners through the Program to Enhance Relational and Communication Skills (PERCS) across Boston Children's Hospital, Harvard Medical School teaching hospitals, nationally and internationally. My leadership has spawned international footholds and programs for relational learning in Italy, Australia, Germany, Argentina, New Zealand, and Peru. I have been a thought leader for a range of timely professional issues such as the use of deception in simulation education, interprofessional education, clinicians' emotional engagement during challenging healthcare conversations, the emotional standard of care, and the ethics of everyday clinical encounters.

## **Teaching and Educational Leadership**

My clinical work and scholarship in pediatric critical care and end-of-life care have contributed to greater understanding of parental perspectives and priorities to improve care, formal and informal social support networks, psychosocial care delivery models, family conferences, and intimate bedside conversations. My work, with families whose children have succumbed in the pediatric intensive care setting, helped delineate factors influencing parental end-of-life decision-making such as perceived quality of life, likelihood of improvement, child's wishes, and perception of suffering. I have championed the priorities that families place on honest communication and trustworthy relationships, ready access to providers, emotional expression and support by providers, preservation of the integrity of the parent-child relationship, and integration of faith in clinical practice. I have designed creative, responsive psychosocial care delivery models to meet the needs of infants, children and their families, conducted research to inform the architectural design of critical care settings, taught interprofessional healthcare providers, and published widely to promote patient and family-centered clinical practice change. Overarching my clinical work and innovation, I have been guided by the principles of empathic engagement, familycentered care, the ethics of everyday clinical practice, and advocacy to effect meaningful cultural change addressing the problems and solutions as perceived by the patients and families themselves, rather than as hypothesized by professionals.

My teaching efforts have amplified my innovative clinical contributions. To improve the emotional standard of care of patients and families, I have designed a simulation-based educational paradigm to

encourage clinicians, across disciplines and experience levels, be more honest, skillful and confident when engaging in challenging healthcare conversations. My collaborative research endeavors successfully established the efficacy and cross-cultural applicability of the educational paradigm and workshops that have now been adapted to the fields of anesthesiology, neonatal and pediatric critical care, palliative care, radiology, general surgery, ophthalmology, and neurology. As a result of the workshops, interprofessional clinicians report long-term improvements in their preparation to hold difficult conversations, more confidence, enhanced communication and relational skills, and decreased anxiety. The educational paradigm has been customized for a wide range of challenging conversations including conveying serious diagnoses, informed consent, parent presence during invasive procedures and resuscitation, spirituality, organ donation, and disclosing adverse medical outcomes. Since conversations about religion and spirituality can be stressful for clinicians, since 2010, together with chaplaincy colleagues, I have pioneered, evaluated and launched a successful simulation-based curriculum designed to train healthcare providers as spiritual generalists to be more capable and confident when assessing and addressing issues of spirituality and religion in everyday clinical encounters. From 2011-2017, I was instrumental in developing, teaching, and evaluating a communication curriculum for radiologists, originally funded by the Radiological Society for North America, focused on conveying serious news, apology and disclosure after adverse medical outcome, and radiation safety. Several manuscripts have followed, with a publication in the *Journal of the American College of Radiology* earning recognition as the best education paper of the year. The curriculum has since been held up as a national model for radiology communication education. In 2012, I was awarded a grant entitled, *Disclosure & Apology*: Leveraging Simulation for Skill-Building & Organizational Change to develop a simulation-based educational approach to apology and disclosure conversations in the aftermath of adverse medical outcomes, some of the most challenging conversations that can be experienced by patients and clinicians alike. In 2015, I was instrumental in securing a major CRICO grant entitled Aligning Family-Staff Expectations in Surgical Informed Consent that will examine parents' and surgeons' perspectives and educate surgeons in the art of aligning expectations for surgery and conducting informed consent. Thus, I have adapted the PERCS educational paradigm across multiple subspecialties with sensitivity and success to help humanize the clinical world- one conversation at a time. Most recently, my research and scholarship has focused on clinicians' emotions during difficult healthcare conversations, and how such emotions can influence patient-provider relationships and clinical care. The first two publications of the series have been honored as best papers of the International Conference on Communication in Healthcare and published in special conference issues of Patient Education and Counseling. I have been recognized with teaching awards for medical humanism, educational film production, and innovative scholarship in medical education. In 2017, I was honored as a Fellow in the Society for Simulation in Healthcare for substantial and enduring commitment and contributions to healthcare simulation. In 2019, I was one of the co-authors of the Healthcare Simulationist Code of Ethics adopted by the Society for Simulation in Healthcare and several international simulation societies.

#### **Significant Supporting Activities**

To promote dissemination of my work, I have published over 125 peer-reviewed articles and chapters, been honored to teach as Visiting Professor at universities across multiple subspecialty departments and delivered presentations and keynote addresses at national and international conferences. In 2014, I was successful in securing funding to lead a collaborative partnership entitled *Advancing Relational Learning Worldwide to Improve Patient Safety and Quality* between the Institute for Professionalism and Ethical Practice and OPENPediatrics to evaluate the translation of the live communication and relational learning workshop format to an on-line interactive moderated workshop approach, specifically addressing issues of apology and disclosure after adverse medical outcomes. In partnering with OPENPediatrics in this translational on-line endeavor, the free interactive digital platform provides medical education and

promotes knowledge in over 100 countries enabling access and scalability to reach vast audiences of clinicians, irrespective of geographical location or ability to pay. This partnership holds the promise to revolutionize relational learning heretofore unavailable in on-line format, thus promoting its educational value globally. In an innovative effort to foster improved healthcare conversations and empathic engagement, and to educate worldwide, I delivered a successful TEDx Talk entitled *On Being Present*, *Not Perfect* that has garnered over 75,000 views and earns 1,000 views monthly. The Talk has been successfully incorporated into nursing and medical school curricula across the country and internationally. Through these innovative teaching efforts and social media platforms, the clinical and educational potential is limitless to improve challenging healthcare conversations and advance the emotional standard of care.

In summary, my clinical career, diverse teaching, and academic scholarship have emphasized patient and family priorities for care, critical care and end-of-life decision-making, and interprofessional communication and relational skills across healthcare boundaries in an effort to promote dignity, humanism and ethical integrity in healthcare. To further my own education and expand my capacity as a clinician, thought leader, educator and consultant, I earned a Master of Bioethics degree in May 2020 from Harvard Medical School. My Capstone project was entitled, *Advancing Everyday Clinical Ethics Education through Innovative Simulation*. Presently, I am senior attending psychologist at Boston Children's Hospital, teaching faculty at the Center for Bioethics, senior scholar at the ARCIM Institute at Filderklinik in Germany, and educational consultant at Foundation Garrahan in Argentina. I consult and teach nationally and internationally on the topics of communication and relational skills, humanism in healthcare, and everyday clinical ethics.
